Background: Patients living with chronic kidney disease (CKD) face significant

physical limitations and psychological challenges due to both disease and treatment. Understanding of symptom burden can be used to determine interventions designed to improve the quality of care during the trajectories of disease. However, symptoms of chronic kidney disease are often under-recognized due to the inadequate and

inconsistent symptoms dimensions of available assessment tools. In the informatics era, there is growing evidence to use the OMAHA system as a rigorous and standardized tool that enables health care providers to comprehensively assess health care problem using multidisciplinary

approach

Purpose: The purpose of this study is to evaluate the feasibility of using the

OMAHA system for identifying and classifying problems of patients

with chronic kidney disease

Design: A feasibility study

Method: This study will conduct in two stages. The initial stage is the

development of standardized CKD assessment tools based on OMAHA system. The literature review will be conducted to identify the existing assessment tools. Face validity will be conduct to analysis the available assessment tools for the identification and classification of health care problems. Problem Classification part of OMAHA system will be used as the referred form to produce the first draft of standardized CKD assessment tools. Then, panel expert will be conducted to refine the first draft followed by the redevising items, mapping, and validity testing

Expected We expect to develop patient assessment tools that will be able to identify the problems of patients with CKD in all stages of the disease
